

## Remote sessions at home: Pupil Code of Conduct

**Remember: remote lessons with your tutor are still lessons and you must behave in the same way as you would in a normal lesson.**

### For all remote lessons:

- Gather everything you need before starting the lesson or session, including a pencil and any spares like reeds, strings or valve oil.
- Listen to and follow the tutor's instructions carefully – this is especially important when communicating via a video link. You may need to slow down your speech, and make sure you don't interrupt.
- If you need to leave the lesson you must ask the tutor's permission
- **Do not record lessons or take screenshots.**
- Do not use the messaging facility or screen sharing.

### At home:

- You must be dressed appropriately: if you are not in your uniform you must wear clothes suitable to be seen in public, and not your pyjamas.
- Find an appropriate place to have your lesson, without distractions like noise or noisy family members.
- Make sure there is an adult at the beginning of the session when you log on and that they remain within earshot in case you need them.
- Choose a space that would be appropriate to invite a teacher into (and not your bedroom).
- Remember that other people will see your background, so make sure that there isn't anything around you that might offend others, like posters or televisions that may show content that is not age appropriate.

**Above all: If you have any problems, for example with the technology, your instrument or if something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable, tell your tutor and/or go and tell another adult.**
